Morton District 709 Weekly Update

COVID diagnoses and quarantines have steadily declined over the last few weeks, which is great news and makes us ready and then some to move on from this topic.

As of Friday, just three students had been confirmed with COVID-19, down from



12 on April 30, with 46 in quarantine relative to 75 last week. Zero staff members were positive, same as last week, with six in at-home isolation against five the week before.

That said, now on to the good stuff.

We had a super successful **Senior Send-Off** at Morton High, and **graduation is scheduled for Saturday, May 15**. This has been a very resilient bunch, and they

deserve an ovation.

Hundreds of parents and community members attended our **Arts in the Park** event this past week, and they were treated to some really wonderful performances by our students. Jefferson Elementary School hosted its **Bike and Walk to School Day**, following up on its Disability and Diversity Awareness Fair of
