# Reading Co-Lots Your World Read to Me Ages 0-5 Children 5 and under who are not yet reading on their own can participate with their parents

Children 5 and under who are not yet reading on their own can participate with their parents by completing a log sheet to earn prizes. They may fill in a circle for every book that is read to them and redeem 25 for a ticket to the Summer Reading Celebration. Additional prizes will be available for reading 50, 75, and 100 books. Please note: There is no online component on READsquared for the Read to Me program. Adults can download the log sheets from home at www.mortonlibrary.org/summerreading

### Children

Entering grades K-6

School-aged children can use a bookmark log or READsquared to record their reading and earn prizes when they meet their reading goals. Completing their first goal will earn them a ticket to the Summer Reading Celebration. Readers who meet at least 4 goals will earn entries into our prize basket raffles. Access READsquared at mortonlibrary.readsquared.com or by downloading the READsquared app.

### **Teens**

Entering grades 7-12

Teens can earn prizes this summer by reading and completing tasks on their Bingo Cards. There will be prizes for meeting specific goals as well as chances to earn entries into weekly drawings. Paper copies of the Bingo Card can be picked up at the Information Desk in the library or you can access a virtual copy by creating an account in READsquared. Access READsquared at mortonlibrary.readsquared.com or by downloading the READsquared app.

### **Adults**

For every hour an adult reads or listens they can fill out a ticket and submit it into our weekly drawing for a \$20 gift card from a local business. All tickets will roll over into the grand prize drawing of a self care basket consisting of multiple gift cards to local businesses. 


Ray's Rockets have been putting down their groove across central Illinois since 2009 playing a kaleidoscope of music from the 1950s thru 1980s.
