## **Morton District 709 Weekly Update**

COVID diagnoses and quarantines were up a notch but not enough to merit concern as we enter the final week of a remarkable and in many ways uplifting 2020-21 school year, capped this coming weekend by the commencement send-off of our resilient seniors to college and careers.

As of Friday, seven students had been confirmed with COVID-19, up from three on May 7, with 76 in quarantine compared to 46 last week. Zero staff members were positive, same as last week, with two in at-home isolation, down from six.

With just four more student days left in the year, we will stay the course with our mask mandate inside our buildings, while loosening that restriction when outdoors and distanced. We have continued to follow Illinois State Board of Education guidance, are well aware of the changing view of the Centers for Disease Control on this subject, and look forward to a mask-free future, depending on circumstances.

Meanwhile, the Tazewell County Health Department is making the Pfizer vaccine available to those between ages 12 and 15 at its Pekin clinic, 1800 Broadway, on Mondays in May between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Walk-ins are welcome.

If last week was Teacher Appreciation Week, we pay tribute to our District Office staff in this week's message, who along with our classroom instructors have seen




