Morton District 709 Weekly Update

COVID diagnoses bumped up slightly this week, mirroring what's happening in the community outside our doors, but again the numbers are a small fraction of our overall student population.

As of Friday, 10 students had tested positive for COVID, up from eight the week before, for an overall infection rate of .31 percent in a student body of more than 3,200. Again, no staff members were out due to the virus. Please see the chart below:

The recent investments our district has made in this defining program, in both new instruments and uniforms, have been very much worth it.

Our football team continues its remarkable season, the best in school history, with a Class 5A semifinal game on Saturday at Kankakee High School. Running



back Seth Glatz leads not just the state but the nation in rushing yardage, with no small help from the "Hogs" –

offensive linemen Ian Mutchler, Brayden McMillen, Andrew Hummel, Broc Schmidt and

James Sauder, along with tight end Jack Stump -- who punch the holes that he runs through. Glatz and defensive back/wide receiver Mac Anderson recently received first team all-state honors.





In other developments, the School Board adopted a nearly \$32.8 million tax levy on Tuesday. District 709 soon will be applying for a state grant that, if successful, would provide some property tax relief by increasing general state aid, to the benefit of local taxpayers.

Finally, the board has selected Joseph Sander as the district's new assistant superintendent. He will take the position being vacated by Dr. Craig Smock when the latter becomes District 709 superintendent next school year. Currently an assistant superintendent at Washington Community High School, Dr. Sander is a longtime Morton resident and former assistant principal at Morton High. He starts July 1, 2022.
