## **Morton District 709 Weekly Update**

COVID diagnoses jumped this past week. Our experience of the last couple of years tells us that a post-holiday bump is not uncommon, given all of the social occasions the holidays typically entail.

As of Friday, 23 students had tested positive for COVID, up from 10 just before the Thanksgiving break, for an overall infection rate of .72 percent in a student body of more than 3,200. No one likes to see the numbers increase, but again, in the overall scheme of things, they are not cause for alarm. We do not see cases concentrated in any one building.
